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We are pleased to announce that the Editorial Board has made the arrangement for the publication of The Barishal University Journal of Business Studies, Volume 10, Issue 1 & 2, a half-yearly publication of Barishal University under the Faculty of Business Studies. The authors are cordially requested to submit papers to the associate editor of the journal by January 31, 2023, following the guidelines below:

- 1. The paper should focus on contemporary aspects of business and economics.
- 2. The paper should be based on original unpublished research work and should demonstrate the authors' own analyses and recommendations.
- 3. All submitted papers would go through a blind peer review process before a final decision of acceptance/rejection for publication is taken.

4. Manuscripts:

Soft copies of the paper should be submitted along with one hard copy to the editor. The manuscript must be typed on one side of an A4 size paper, double spaced with margin: left, 1.5" and others, 1.0" and should not normally exceed 15 pages including reference list; font name: Times New Roman; font-size: 12. The article should be in one column.

An abstract of a maximum of 150 words with keywords should be submitted. The cover page of the manuscript should contain: (a) A title of the manuscript, (b) Name (s) of the author(s), (c) Address of the author(s) including designation and institutional affiliation, and (d) Phone number and E-mail address.

5. References: The details of all references should follow the Harvard Referencing method mentioned as follows:
